

MURCHISON FIRE BRIGADE CFA

Winter. That awful word we dread is not far away now. With winter coming a lot of fire hazards will emerge and these are usually associated with the warming of personal space which could include the use of electrical, gas or solid fuel heating. Please ensure all precautions are taken when using a heating medium. A good start would be an annual pre-season service by an authorised representative, flue cleaning where applicable and a smoke alarm check.

Heaters are a major cause of fires, especially during the winter months. Ensure all electrical appliances are turned off before going to bed and remember when drying clothes '1 metre from the heater'!

Kitchens! The kitchen is the room where most fires occur in the home. Do not leave cooking unattended - 'Look when you cook'! Check all appliances are off before leaving home or going to sleep. Never use water to extinguish an oil or grease fire. Ensure a dry powder extinguisher and fire blanket are at hand.

Get a a copy of the CFA Booklet 'HOME FIRE SAFETY' - available free from the Murchison Post Office, Pharmacy, Bakery, Supa-Value store, Garage, Neighbourhood House and of course, Murchison Fire Station.

Let the CFA help you, to help yourself!

Xavier Reilly: Melbourne Stair Climb Challenge 2023. Our Murchison Member Xav Reilly has enlisted in the Melbourne Firefighter Stair Climb Challenge to be held on 2nd Sept next. Proceeds are for Charities and this is Xaviers story:

"Hello! My name is Xavier Reilly and I am a member of the Murchison Fire Brigade. I have been a member now for over 14 years starting with Murchison Juniors and moving up to an active firefighting role where I currently hold the office of 4th Lieutenant. From 1st July I will move into the role of 3rd Lt under the Brigades recently introduced succession planning system. In my time as a firefighter I have experienced a lot both mentally and physically, watched colleagues often struggle with one problem or another. After helping a mate complete a charity 'Spartan Race' in QLD last year it inspired me to do something similar so I have entered the Melbourne Fire Fighter Stair Climb challenge. This entails climbing 28 floors of a Melbourne building whilst wearing full Protective Clothing and Breathing Apparatus. Not a small feat I can tell you!

My charitable causes are Cancer Research and Mental Health Support. Both areas I feel strongly about. In this I am asking the good people of Murchison and District to support me in this challenge. Any donation towards my personal target of \$1,000 before I climb would be very welcome, in fact awesome!

HISTORY OF THE CHURCHES IN MURCHISON PRESBYTERIAN/UNITING CHURCH

From 1859 the Rev. A. McNicol was the first Presbyterian minister at Rushworth, travelling to Murchison and to Whroo to conduct services there. A building made of slab walls and a shingle roof was built in Murchison as the church, close to where the present-day Uniting Church stands now. The Presbyterian congregation used the building for social gatherings and a day school as well. After Rev. McNicol moved to Wallan in 1861, Murchison was without a long-term Minister and by 1870 the Presbyterian community worshipped with the United Methodist Free Church, swelling the numbers there considerably.

The Methodist minister was Rev. T.B. Swift at that time. In 1873 Rev. Swift fell out of favour with the Methodist Elders and a move was afoot to transfer him to another area. However, the Presbyterian Church reformed and approached Rev. Swift to minister to the Presbyterians and he accepted the position, much to the disapproval of the Methodists!

By October 1876 the building of the brick church commenced, designed by notable architect Charles Webb. William Brown, the town's Saddler and active community member, laid the foundation stone in November 1877. In April 1878 the church building was completed and officially opened by Rev. James Nish, Clerk of the General Assembly.

Rev. Swift proved a popular Minister and when he moved on in 1882, he was presented with a farewell gift of 200 sovereigns – a very large amount of money at the time. During the years he cared for the Presbyterian flock in Murchison, he also established churches at Tatura and at Mooroopna. He was replaced by Rev. William Matthew and then after two years, Murchison became attached to Tatura where Rev. Chambers was the Minister. By 1901 Murchison and Goulburn Weir joined together to become a distinct charge.

The Presbyterian Manse was built at No. 3 Stevenson Street in 1902 and the weatherboard Hall constructed next to the Church in 1926.

In June 1977 the Presbyterian Church at Murchison became part of the Uniting Church. Rev. W. Higgins was inducted as the first Uniting Church Minister and moved into the new manse which had been built in Meteorite Street.

The current minister, Rev. Brian Spencer, lives on his own property out of Colbinabbin.

The Parish, known as Waranga Uniting Churches, now consists of preaching places in Colbinabbin, Rushworth, Tatura and Murchison. Sadly, the Stanhope, Goulburn Weir and Toolamba buildings have closed and congregation members now join with Rushworth, Murchison and Tatura.

Today to keep up with modern technology the Church Services are presented via Zoom to each Congregation from the Host Church, which rotates around the Parish weekly. These services are also viewed on line by folk who live outside the Parish.

TEN YEARS IN THE MAKING

Over a hundred Murchison residents and friends celebrated the opening of the new Murchison Men's Shed on Saturday the 6th May 2023.

The chairman of the Murchison Community Planning Committee, Mr Glen Thomas, opened proceedings and invited the Deputy Mayor of the Greater Shepparton City Council to acknowledge the traditional land owners and officially declare the shed open. It was pleasing to see the support and attendance of ex and current council employees, Josh Lee, Renee Scott, Karen Kidd, Paul Newcombe, and Steve Varcoe who all played a major role in reaching our goal, as well as Sam Birrell, National Member of Parliament for Shepparton and Liz Tatai from the Department of Families, Fairness and Housing.

Paul Sladdin, President of the AMSA, and Derek O'Leary, CEO of the VMSA both spoke of the importance of Men's Sheds. More than ever before, men are looking towards men's sheds as a safe and welcoming environment to talk about their problems and seek companionship, learn new skills and gain self esteem.

Its not only the men that benefit, but also the community in which they live, and this was evident by the number of residents and members of other shed who attended the opening. It was pleasing to meet members from Katandra West and District, Violet Town, Shepparton, Tallygaroopna, Stanhope and Shepparton East Men's Sheds adding their support on the day.

In the final speech, Murchison Men's Shed President, Dennis McCullagh gave a short history lesson about the shed over the past 10 years, and thanked the Shepparton Council who supplied the land and the building, the Longleat Winery owners, Guido and Sandra Vazzoler, for allowing us to use our old shed rent free since the liquidation of the nursing home.

It was also good to see members of the SES, CFA, Bowling Club, Lions Club, Caravan Park, Police, RSL, Neighbourhood House all present and supporting our day.

The day finished with a fantastic spread of a variety of sandwiches, cakes and fruit platters which was arranged by members of the Murchison Bowling Club.

The highlight of the day was possibly the members shoot which included the reunion of founding and life member member, Wal Harrison, from Tatura, founding member, Ken Mair, who travelled by train from Melbourne, and Alan Munro, stalwart and life member who also travelled from Melbourne.



EXPLORE NEWSPAPERS AND MAGAZINES FOR FREE WITH GOULBURN VALLEY LIBRARIES

Goulburn Valley Libraries offers a range of magazines and newspapers that you can access when you visit any of our libraries but did you know that you can access newspapers from all over Australia and magazines from around the world all for free with your Goulburn Valley Libraries membership without leaving home?

Newsbank features a variety of local, regional, and national news and information, including The Shepparton News, Cobram Courier, and the Yarrawonga Chronicle - all available remotely 24/7 on any device.

Explore credible, vetted news sources from across Australia to stay informed on events, people and issues related to business, government, economy, sports, culture, and more. Head to the Goulburn Valley Libraries website at https://www.gvlibraries.com.au/ and scroll down toward the bottom of the home page. Click on the Access Australia icon and it will take you to the Newsbank website. If you happen to be visiting one of our libraries, including our Mobile Library, and connect to our wifi that's all you will need to do. You can start searching for newspapers or topics straight away. If you are connecting from home or somewhere else then you will be asked to enter your library membership number. This is the number near the barcode on your library card. Once you've logged in you can search for a particular topic, date or newspaper. You can read single articles or whole issues.

Love a good magazine? Got a favourite topic your passionate about? You can access over 4000 magazines from around the world through the Libby app on your smartphone or tablet. All you need to do is download the Libby app and sign in (just once) with your Goulburn Valley Libraries membership.

You'll have access to magazines including The Australian Women's Weekly, Better Homes and Gardens Australia, Golf, Gardening Australia, 4x4 Magazine Australia, Wheels, Men's Health Australia, Australian Geographic (there's a gorgeous kelpie on the front of the May-June edition). Not sure what the kids are talking about? Check out Minecraft World Magazine. Having trouble keeping up with Kochie? Try Money Magazine. The list isn't quite endless (as I said there are over 4000) but with so many to choose from there's sure to be something for everyone.
