Hi everyone, once again I am getting in touch to let you know what is going on with the walking and riding trails around our town.

MURCHISON-RUSHWORTH

Trail users may have noticed a new hydration station on the Impey Street entrance to the trail. This station has a dog bowl at the base and drinking and bottle filling fittings. Thanks go to Goulburn Valley Water and the Murchison Community Planning Group.

Meanwhile there is also progress on the Waranga section (11 Km between Chanel Inlet Road and Ruthworth) of the trail. The Campaspe council anticipate obtaining a planning permit this month (July) for the trail. It will then seek tenders to:

- Remove selected native vegetation
- Repair bridges (six to complete)
- Construct the trail (10 km gravel and 1 km asphalt)

It is still hoped and expected the trail will be completed by the end of March 2024.

GOULBURN RIVER TRAIL

Finally, a group called GV Trails is seeking to create a trail from Murchison to connect with Toolamba, Tatura, Mooroopna (and Shepparton). Potentially this trail could link to established trails such as the Great Victorian Rail Trail, providing a continuous route for hiking, horse and bike riding tours.

Shepparton Council has funded and awarded the contract to conduct detailed track designs and feasibility studies to Stantec Consulting. Originally due to be complete this month, we believe staff shortages and turnover have delayed the project and are awaiting an update. So, stay tuned....

FREE SMOKE ALARM INSTALLATION - **ONLY WORKING SMOKE ALARMS SAVE LIVES!** This is a true statement and the catchwords of our latest CFA campaign to ensure the citizens of Murchison are kept as safe as possible by their offer to install smoke alarms powered by a 10 year Lithium battery into the homes of residents. This campaign is being promoted on the local social media pages and CFA Murchison Fire Brigade Facebook site and will soon be accompanied by a household letterbox drop. CFA hope the letterbox drop will remind residents to check their alarms are working properly by regularly testing and that batteries are replaced wherever necessary. Please remember –

If you do not have working smoke alarms in your home you are risking your life and the lives of your loved ones.

You will not hear a fire or smell the smoke when asleep and by the time it reaches you it will be too late.

By law, all homes are required to have working smoke alarms to living areas but CFA also recommends having them installed also in bedrooms.


LIGHTHORSE EXHIBITION IN SHEPPARTON

It is worth a visit to this Exhibition in Shepparton. Many skilled horsemen who were local Murchison residents enlisted in the Light Horse Regiments and Victorian Mounted Rifles that were eventually absorbed into the Australian Imperial Forces (AIF).

Well known families were represented in the Regiments; men from the Anderson, Brisbane, Day, Foley, Gregory, Groves, Kearney, Keenan, Lawson, McCracken, Mason, Miller, Pavey, Thompson, Uphill and Welfare families enlisted.

This photo from 1937 shows the local Victorian Mounted Rifles Regiment lined up outside numbers 3 & 5 Stevenson Street before Storey Weeks, Waranga Shire President and Lord Huntingfield, Governor of Victoria who was in Murchison to officially open the current steel span bridge over the Goulburn.

The exhibition will be on show throughout October as part of the Victorian Seniors Festival. There are several prizes to be won, including the major prize to be selected by "People's Choice". Every person that comes along to see the exhibition can vote for their favourite artwork.

The Coalition committed \$5 million towards this project.



ENERGY EFFICIENCY GRANTS

The first round of the Energy Efficiency Grants for Small and Medium Sized Enterprises program is now open and includes grants of between \$10,000 and \$25,000 to businesses in the region including coolstores, hydroponic vegetable production, orchards and motels.

The grants can be used for a broad range of measures including installing heat pumps, lighting upgrades, space and water heating improvements and installing energy monitoring systems.
