

# **CFA MURCHISON FIRE BRIGADE**

Hello Murchison. August approaches and as we slide towards the rear end of winter, **Home Fire Safety** continues to be the main topic of Brigade advice.

My apologies for being repetitive but keeping the home fire safe is a paramount consideration and while the Murchison Community has a very good track record in this respect, we must not become complacent.

A few of the Home Fire Safety tips we need to consider are;

Domestic Wood Burning Fires and Stoves: Before operation or re-lighting ensure the flue is clean. Over time chimneys and flues will accumulate a residue of creosote which is highly combustible at elevated temperatures and could lead to chimney fires causing damage to the dwelling. Flue cleaning before use is strongly suggested. You might think it is clean enough, but you can't see the deposit.

Electric Blankets: Check the condition of the blanket before and during use and discard if signs of wear and exposure of wiring is observed. Please ensure that the blanket is switched off before retiring.

Portable and fixed heating appliances: Use carefully and keep out of the way of children and pets. Never leave these appliances unsupervised. Always ensure that air outlets or inlets are never blocked which is extremely important when using gas fired appliances as the combustion process produces toxic carbon monoxide. Be aware when these appliances used for drying clothes.

#### Remember - 'ONE METRE FROM THE HEATER'!

**Gas Patio Heaters:** Keep on a flat, solid, non flammable surface ensuring all gas connections are tight and the unit is turned off when not in use. Never use this type of heating system indoors. Carbon Monoxide is a killer; only use gas appliances approved for indoor use and ensure adequate ventilation.

Chimineas or Outdoor Fire Pits: Keep at least 3 metres away from flammable items including buildings, decking and other structures. Extinguish it with water before leaving.

Electrical Appliances: A common cause of fire. All equipment should have an Aust Standard or Regulatory Compliance Mark (RCM). Ensure power boards have overload protection and aren't covered eg. by clothing, pillows, doonas etc. Do not piggyback into one socket or use double adaptors. One plug per device is recommended. Also beware of the dangers of re-charging computers and mobile phones. Do not cover up these items while charging or leave them unattended to charge. Be aware also of the dangers associated with charging mobile Lithium Battery powered electrical appliances such as cars and scooters, and to a lesser extent tools.

Cigarettes and open flames: Cigarettes, candles, incense and oil burners can cause fires. Always extinguish any open flame or cigarette before leaving home or going to sleep. Just think, that beautiful soporific aroma of a scented candle burning before sleep might easily turn into your worst nightmare if not extinguished.

Home Fire Escape Plan: If you haven't got one then make one. It could save your life or lives of loved ones and pets. Don't ever neglect your pets, they are also part of the family!

Some questions to ask yourself -

Are your smoke alarms correctly placed and working?

Have you the correct extinguishers for your situation and fire blanket ready for use?

Have you developed and practiced a home fire escape plan?

Is the Emergency Number 000 prominently displayed?

Is your fireplace safe?

Is your kitchen safe?

Are your electrical appliance in good working order and power boards not overloaded?

I you can answer 'yes' to the above questions then you are on the correct track to safety.

Should you wish to discuss any aspect of Home Fire Safety please do not hesitate to contact CFA Murchison Fire Brigade.

We can also arrange for a personal Home Fire Safety assessment through one of our experts should you feel it necessary. Our Fire Station on Robinson Street Murchison is usually manned for routine maintenance purposes between 0900 and 1200 on Sundays and If the doors are open so are we, so call in and have a chat.

One more important thing is that should you ever be faced with an emergency requiring fire brigade attendance please do **not** call the station. It is unattended and we don't live there.

Calmly dial 000 and when answered request the Emergency Service required your name, nature and location of the emergency and a contact phone number. Listen carefully to any instructions given by the operator. Help will be dispatched as soon as possible.

#### **ANNIVERSARY OF THE SINKING OF THE SHIP Montevideo Maru**

July 1 st this year marked the 83 rd anniversary of the loss of the Montevideo Maru, a ship transporting Australian Prisoners of War, sadly sunk by friendly fire in 1942.

An American Submarine torpedoed this Japanese ship, as there were no markings to indicate it was transporting over 1,000 Australian Prisoners of War. All on board drowned and so it is recorded as Australia's worst maritime disaster.

The location of the wreckage, off the coast of the Philippines, was only located 2 years ago. It is lying deeper under the sea than the wreck of the Titanic and although the position is now known, the wreck will be left undisturbed.

Stanhope has an impressive mural in their town of the Montevideo Maru, and interpretive signage telling the story and details of locals whose lives were lost that day.

Murchison men also lost their lives due to this tragedy. One was Henry Anthony Gregory, who had been working as a County Court Judge in New Guinea for about 20 years. His wife Amy, only knew of his certain fate after the war ended when records revealed he had been on the Montevideo Maru. Henry Gregory was the nephew of E J Gregory, prominent citizen of Murchison and proprietor of Gregory's Bridge Hotel. His wife Amy, was E J's daughter.


Another member of the Gregory family was on the ill-fated Montevideo Maru. Norman Gregory, a gunner in the Army and only 23 years of age, also lost his life that day in 1942.

Norman was the grandson of E J Gregory and youngest brother of well-known Murchison identity, Keith Gregory.

Recent information from the Crawford family has revealed that the life of another person connected to Murchison was lost on the Montevideo Maru. Allen Pattinson married Connie Crawford who grew up on the Andrew Crawford family farm on River Road, North Murchison. They had only married in 1941. Allen was in the AIF in Rabaul when taken prisoner and when he lost his life, Connie was left a widow at 35 with a very young son.

The sadness surrounding the sinking of the Montevideo Maru touched many Goulburn Valley people. It is worth a drive to Stanhope to have a look at the mural, read the well-presented information on the panels located across the road from the mural to find out more about this part of Australian War history.
















## Shock at fourth rise in a year for burial prices at RPCV

The shock announcement of a fourth price rise in a year for burial costs at Remembrance Parks Central Victoria (RPCV) cemeteries raises further doubts about the trust's leadership and ability to govern, says Liberal Member for Northern Victoria Wendy Lovell.

A massive hike in the price of a standard lawn grave will mean grieving families face potential cost increases of over \$1,600 dollars – up to 86% more – to bury a loved one in newly developed areas at RPCV cemeteries in central and northern Victoria, including sites in Greater Bendigo, Greater Shepparton, and Donnybrook. In 2024, RPCV raised fees by the statutory CPI increase on 1 July. The cemetery trust then made the controversial move to further increase prices by an average 14% in December 2024 after a price and product review, followed by a third increase on 1 July 2025, in accordance with the CPI.

A day later, on 2 July 2025, RPCV announced a fourth price increase in the form of a new and much more expensive fee structure for graves in newly developed sections of their cemeteries that open after July 2025 – with new sections already under development at Eaglehawk and Pine Lodge.

Standard lawn graves in all newly opened sections will now cost \$3,600, which is \$1,665 more than a standard lawn grave currently costs at the trust's White Hills and Kialla West cemeteries – an 86% increase.

A standard lawn grave at Axedale will increase by \$1,180, or 48.8%. At the remaining locations, including Bendigo, Eaglehawk, Kangaroo Flat, Pine Lodge, and Donnybrook, the standard lawn grave will increase by \$730 or 25.4%. Funeral directors, and family members caring for ageing parents, are now deeply concerned that as existing sections of the cemeteries quickly fill up, the current fee structure for those plots will soon no longer be available. Families seeking a resting place for their loved ones will then be forced to pay the new and much more expensive fees that will apply to all new sections that open at cemeteries after July 2025. These massive fee increases follow a series of operational, financial, and governance scandals at RPCV, and raise further doubts about the financial and managerial competence of the current board and chair. The RPCV trust failed to table its 2022-23 and 2023-24 annual reports until March 2025, and did not hold the required annual general meetings during that time, meaning the board avoided public scrutiny and accountability at the very time that its cemeteries were involved in a series of operational scandals. In 2022 RPCV attempted to implement an exorbitant increase in the cost of burials, which was squashed after significant community backlash. In 2023 came the adornment scandal when cherished family mementos were removed from graves without permission. Then 2024 started with two controversial incidents in which graves were recklessly disturbed by maintenance crews, and ended in December with a dramatic increase in the cost of a plot and burial. Now RPCV has begun the 2025-26

financial year with yet another massive hike in prices, by dressing up the existing standard lawn grave in a newly opened section as if it were a new and better memorial product.

Comments attributable to Liberal Member for Northern Victoria Wendy Lovell:

"Massively increasing the fees for standard lawn graves at RPCV cemeteries shows that the trust's board and chair are completely out of touch, and don't understand the financial pressure that families are under during a cost of living crisis." "The current chair has overseen a series of operational, financial, and governance scandals during her tenure, but has avoided scrutiny by failing to table annual reports or hold annual general meetings." "The Allan Labor Government reappointed the chair just in time to announce a massive increase in fees, demonstrating Labor's obsession with taking money from the pockets of Victorian families to cover over its own financial incompetence."

"Labor can't manage money, can't manage cemeteries, and Victorians are paying the price."
