ENJOY WALKING THE SOLAR SYSTEM LABYRINTH IN METEORITE PARK

"The labyrinth is one of the oldest of symbols; it depicts the way to the unknown centre, the mystery of death and rebirth, the risk of the search, the danger of losing the way, the quest, the finding and the ability to return."

If you haven't already seen it or walked it, Murchison's solar system labyrinth located at the rear of Meteorite Park in Stevenson Street is an interesting place to visit. It is sure to inspire you, as you will see all the planets positioned on the labyrinth at the time the Murchison meteor landed at 10.58am on 28th September 1969. An interpretative sign near the labyrinth's entrance also tells you more about the planets and the origins of a labyrinth. With summer holidays coming up, this would make an ideal walking activity for families and friends.





A recent working bee saw several members of Murchison & District Historical Society spring-cleaning the surface of the labyrinth, sprucing it up for visitors to enjoy.

Listed below, you will find several hints about walking a labyrinth:

- Walk with intent, not expectation.
- There is no wrong way to walk the labyrinth.
- Find your own pace simply focus on the path and put one foot in front of the other.
- Pass other walkers when necessary simply step aside and then rejoin the path.
- You cannot get lost in the labyrinth if you miss the path you will end up either back in the centre or back at the beginning.
- Use anything that happens in the labyrinth as a metaphor for what is happening in your life.
- Be present in the moment.

MURCHISON FIRE BRIGADE CFA BY BOB LANGFORD

As followers of our CFA Murchison Fire Brigade and the Murchison Victoria Community Facebook pages will be aware, the Chief Fire Officer has declared the Fire Danger Period (FDP) for this 2023/24 season will commence for the shires of Greater Shepparton, Moira and Strathbogie at 0100hrs on Monday 27th November. This means that by the time this issue of 3610 is published the FDP will be in effect. Make sure you know how the FDP will affect you by visiting the website <u>www.cfa.vic.gov.au/can</u>. Remember, it is your responsibility to comply with the restrictions of the FDP. Penalties apply for flouting the regulations.

The onset of the FDP always brings its own worries as the harvest season is well under way and property owners continue preparing for the summer. Vic is facing a hot and dry fire season this year with a high level of dry vegetation growth so please ensure all activity is compliant with the set requirements of the FDP and undertaken with safety in mind. Remember to always be aware of the consequences of your actions on others.



The advent of the FDP brings the possibility of Total Fire Ban (TFB) periods. A TFB may be declared by the authorities at very short notice on days when the weather conditions are forecast to be at a dangerous level making any fires likely to spread rapidly and difficult to control. To reiterate, penalties apply for transgression of regulations in respect of TFB's.

Fire Danger Ratings (FDR) tell you how dangerous a fire could be if one started in your area. There are 4 levels of FDR ranging from Moderate through High, Extreme, and then into Catastrophic. FDR's are issued on days when there is a fire risk. Acquaint yourselves with the FDR by visiting the website <u>www.cfa.vic.gov.au/afdrs</u>

How well do you know Fire? Fire seasons in Vic can be long and devastating. If you live near bushland, paddocks or grassland, proper preparation can help protect you and your family from fire. Prepare your Fire Plan early and do not hesitate to act if threatened. Prepare, and take your first steps to safety. CFA and Vic Govt. have the information and advice to help anyone prepare for bushfire and grassfire so checkout the website fireplanner.vic.gov.au and get ready for the fire season.

You may decide to travel over the FDP but in your planning for the trip have due regard to conditions and warnings prevalent not only at your destination but along your route. Keep an eye on the weather and check the FDR's, download the Vic Emergency App and be prepared to change your plans. See the Travellers Checklist on <u>www.cfa.vic.gov.au/travel</u>.

CFA Murchison Brigade has been training and upskilling over the winter period along with the neighbouring brigades we depend on for mutual support and are confident that we can meet the challenge of this seasons FDP full on.

In case of emergency please do not call the Fire Station but dial 000 and when answered clearly state your name and the type of emergency. Help will be despatched at the earliest opportunity.



NEWS FROM GOULBURN VALLEY LIBRARIES



With the Mobile Library off the road (it still has a tummy ache) you may have noticed that Andre has been visiting Murchison in the library car instead. Andre has been rocking up with his crates of library goodies for you to peruse and borrow when he visits during the regular Mobile Library visiting hours.

We understand this is a very small collection. You can browse the Goulburn Valley Libraries online catalogue instead, and place items on hold. Simply go to <u>www.gvlibraries.com.au</u>. and start searching. You will need your library membership number and PIN to place holds.

If you can't make it during these regular visits, why not try the Library Locker. First time user of the Murchison Library Locker? No problem.

Located in the Heritage Centre carpark, the Library Locker provides a great way to pick up your books any time. Mobile Library staff will load your items into the lockers weekly. You'll get a text to your phone when your items are available. Just tap the link in the text to get the QR code, scan it at the locker and take your items. You can also browse our website and place holds on items you would like to borrow.

The lockers are available 24/7 in a well-lit area and are easily accessible to all. There are a variety of locker sizes, so you can get a single item or a whole stack of books! You can also return any items to the library – just scan the library barcode on each item and drop it into the return locker at the bottom.

To put a book on hold to be picked it up at either the Mobile Library or the Library Locker you can use any of the following options:

Access the catalogue on the Library Locker screen.

Log into the Goulburn Valley Libraries online catalogue, browse and put items on hold.

Use the Libraries Victoria app on your smart device.

Send us an email at <u>mobile@gvlibraries.com.au</u> and let us know which items you would like to put on hold.

CFA BRIGADES IN NEED OF INVESTMENT AHEAD OF FIRE SEASON

NaNationals Member for Euroa Annabelle Cleeland has called on the Labor Government to ensure local CFA brigades are properly equipped to handle what is expected to be an intense fire season.

After documents from Fire Rescue Victoria were made public recently, reports indicated that more than half of Melbourne's fire truck fleet is over 15 years old, while the situation is even more dire for our regional brigades.

The local CFA brigade in Murchison has two tankers, one of which is a staggering 34 years old.

"So many of our dedicated volunteer fire brigades are stuck with the majority of their vehicles, pumpers, and tankers being over 20 years old," Ms Cleeland said.

"Having met with many brigade captains and volunteers recently, there are serious concerns about these ageing vehicles, as well as the culture of the CFA, as it deals with a lack of funding and support from the Labor Government."

Speaking in Parliament recently, Ms Cleeland said failing to provide our brigades with fit-for-purpose vehicles, together with several other recent policy decisions, would be putting our communities, and volunteer firefighters, at risk.

"With the fire season approaching, our CFA brigades are in desperate need of appliances that are fit for purpose in order to protect our volunteer firefighters and to protect our communities," Ms Cleeland said.

"History has shown the only time this Government shows an interest in resourcing rural brigades is after tragic fire events.

Ms Cleeland has invited any local brigades to meet with her ahead of the high fire danger period, with the local member eager to ensure that the dedicated volunteers who put their lives on the line for our community have their voices heard.

WATER UPDATE

Recently, I voted against the Water Amendment (Restoring Our Rivers) Bill 2023 because I strongly oppose using the blunt instrument of water buybacks to achieve environmental outcomes at the expense of productive agriculture, jobs and regional communities.

The passage of this legislation through the House of Representatives was a sad day for people across the Murray-Darling Basin who face the economic and social destruction of their communities. It was disappointing to see Independent MPs led by Member for Indi, Helen Haines, vote with the Labor Government in favour of this devastating legislation.

The Bill still needs to navigate the Senate, and I continue to work towards a sensible outcome which includes the reinstatement of a socio-economic test that prevents buybacks unless there is a proven neutral or positive impact for Basin communities. We can't afford Labor's water plan and the fight isn't over.
