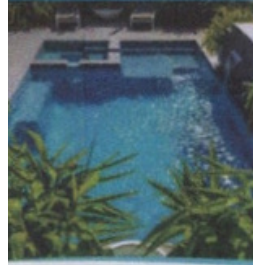

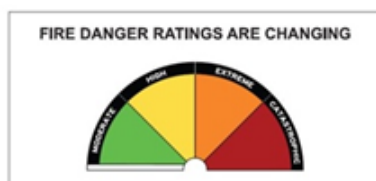


MURCHISON FIRE BRIGADE CFA

Most of us are aware of the roadside 'Fire Danger' signage whilst travelling through Victoria. These have now been revised with the system expanded to create consistency across Australia. This will enable emergency information to be clear and concise, changing the forecasting of fire danger and assessment of fire behaviour throughout Australia.

Changes to the present, and shortly to be redundant system will be made gradually from SEPTEMBER 1st, 2022



The ratings have been re-classified into four categories, MODERATE, HIGH, EXTREME and CATASTROPHIC.

A brief description of these :-

MODERATE: Plan and Prepare

HIGH: Be ready to act

EXTREME: Take action now to protect your life and property

CATASTROPHIC: For your survival leave bush fire risk areas

The new 4 level system replaces the 6 level system and provides clear action advice depending on the level of risk. Find out more by visiting - www.cfa.vic.gov.au/afdrs

HOME FIRE SAFETY: As winter continues, please be aware of all aspects of home safety, monitoring children's activities and ensuring your dwelling doesn't represent a hazard. Please pay special attention to electrical safety by ensuring that plugs and sockets are fitted correctly. Don't overload power boards, sleep with your electric blanket on and do not overcharge mobile phones or laptops as these small items can generate enormous heat. Find out more by obtaining a copy of the CFA publication 'Home Fire Safety'. This booklet is available free of charge and maybe found at a number of shops in the village and at the Neighbourhood House.

SMOKE ALARMS: Please do not neglect smoke alarms and test regularly. Remember – 'ONLY WORKING SMOKE ALARMS SAVE LIVES'. Find out more by visiting - www.cfa.vic.gov.au/smokealarms

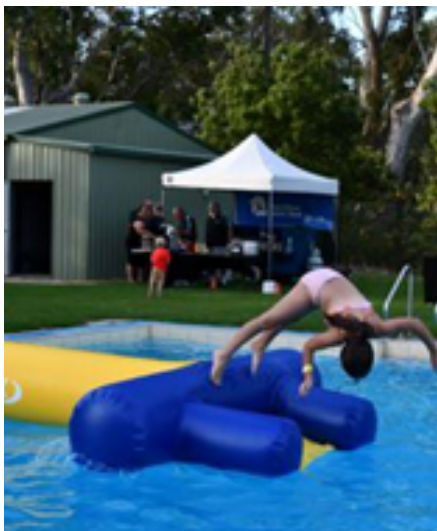
NEW EXCITING POWER SAVING BONUS PROGRAM FROM 1 JULY 2022

As you all might be aware of by now, Premier Dan Andrews recently announced a \$250 million funding package to help ease cost of living pressures for Victorian households.

From 1 July 2022, a new \$250 payment will be open to all Victorian households who use the Victorian Energy Compare website to compare their energy deal and seek out a better price.

This new program will be open to all households, and concession card holders who previously received the bonus will be able to apply for it again.

Just over 220 Neighbourhood Houses are currently participating in the Power Saving Bonus outreach program, facilitated by Neighbourhood Houses Victoria and Good Shepherd in partnership with the Department of Environment, Water, Land and Planning (DELWP).

A very special Exhibition at Shepparton Art Museum (SAM) is Artworks from Prisoner of War Camp 13 Murchison. It presents the works of Hans Wolter von Gruenewaldt, a German civilian imprisoned in Camp 13 Murchison. Although not formally trained, he was a very talented artist, and created a prolific collection of art during his five and half years in the Camp during World War 2.

This is a rare collection, safeguarded and greatly valued by the Murchison community and has not been seen outside Murchison. Large murals that are on display from the RSL ANZAC HALL, are unique. In contrast to these caricatures, serious life-like portraits of compatriots are exhibited. Scanned sketches, paintings and drawings from note books are on show via a rolling slide show, and expose an enormous breadth of styles, topics and use of a wide range of art materials. This provides a dazzling variety of works that enthrall the viewer.

This is a joint project between the Murchison RSL sub-branch and the Murchison & District Historical Society, supported by Shepparton Art Museum through SAM SQUARED PROGRAM and the Exhibition concludes on Sunday 11th September, so make sure you visit before it closes. Entry to SAM is free.

She describes poetry as one of her senses that allows her to turn her experiences into art and is currently working on her first poetry collection. As a proud African-Muslim woman it is important to her that young women from her community are represented and their stories are shared. Poetry is her connection to communities, land and her people. Having the chance to make people feel something will always be her goal as an artist.

Poetry Slam is for not just those that like poetry: it's for anyone who likes live entertainment. Prepare yourself though, whether you're cheering for your favourite poet or you are selected as one of the 5 judges, audience participation is a must. Be prepared for an entertaining evening of witty words and provocative prose.
