If you want to know more about our amazing local Lions club please don't hesitate in contacting myself and I will happily give you the details.





Now is the time to PREPARE your property for the coming fire season, cut long grass, clear leaves around the property, and from gutters on your buildings. These little things can stop an ember from a fire starting a new fire.

Murchison and surrounds are situated in a wildfire prone area of the State and it is important all residents whether in the urban or rural environments take steps to minimize the risk of an outbreak of fire in our area. PLAN and PREPARE your properties for the season, but also THINK of the affect your actions will have on others. The watchwords this season are THINK, PLAN & PREPARE. Guidance can be obtained from the CFA website: cfa.vic.gov.au.

Town residents who consider burning off prior to the Fire Danger Period are recommended to contact the Shepparton Council first and check the by-laws covering this particular activity. Landholders in the rural sector are recommended to advise CFA by calling and registering their burn off to: 1800 668 511. Registering this way avoids CFA responding vehicles to unnecessary smoke sightings. Please remember that when these vehicles are responding to smoke sighting's they are unavailable for other emergency calls. This can affect you! CFA Murchison has already turned out to one unregistered burn off this season as the landholder deemed it unnecessary to register. Care for your local community and do the right thing. No cost involved, just an 1800 phone call. THINK, PLAN & PREPARE!

If travelling know what fire ban district you are in and what the days rating is our district is Northern Country.





SMOKE ALARMS. CFA Murchison crews are busy throughout the town fitting smoke alarms to local resident's dwellings. This is a free service. Interested residents are invited to contact our colleague Emily Guthrie at CFA Shepparton Regional Office to register for this service. Emily can be reached at ph: 0447 415 849 or via email at emily.guthrie@cfa.vic.gov.au. Please note that this free service does not extend to rental properties, this is the responsibility of the Landlord. Commercial properties for instance holiday rentals or B&B are also exempt. Readers might have elderly or vulnerable family or friends living in their own homes who might benefit from a smoke alarm installation. If this is the case you can register on their behalf, but please discuss it with them first. Remember these

smoke alarms are non-invasive and have a guaranteed battery life of 10 years. Consider this replacement as part of your THINK, PLAN & PREPARE.

COMMUNITY FIRESAFE – ADVANCE NOTICE! CFA intend to hold a town meeting on this subject on Thursday 23rd November. All members of the Community will be invited to attend. Chaired by CFA Community Engagement, all aspects of FIRESAFE will be discussed in public forum. Murchison Community will receive formal notice of this through local media in due course.

BRIGADE GENERAL. You may notice some CFA traffic on the roads in and around Murchison. The Brigade is participating in pre-season exercises, sometimes singularly or jointly with other local Brigades and of course driver training. In the last month we attended a group exercise held at the Murchison Golf club to work together and prepare for the coming fire season.

Keep a look out on our Facebook page for the commencement date for fire restrictions.

Please don't forget that in the case of emergency do NOT call the Fire Station. Dial 000 and when answered clearly give your name, nature of emergency and address, and your contact number. Units will be dispatched to assist at the earliest opportunity. Stay safe!

Guided History walks in Murchison will continue until the end of October to celebrate History Month and Seniors Month.

The information supplied may surprise you! Did you know we had paddle steamers in Murchison? Have you heard of Plan Spotters or a Coffee Palace? Why did the manual telephone exchange have to be staffed 24 hours a day? Learn about the Aboriginal Protectorate Station and rare historic Aboriginal Graves. Hear how locals saved the buildings in the main street from being burnt down and also inundated by flood waters. And you can admire the lovely restored period homes in the town. And of course, we love to tell people about the Murchison meteorite!

Each Wednesday at 9.30 am and Sundays from 1.30pm, we start the walk from Murchison Heritage Centre, 4 Stevenson Street, Murchison. STEPPING BACK IN TIME – a walk around the centre of town, lasts about 40 – 50 minutes, with pauses and seating available along the way. WALK 'N TALK follows the same pathway but has the option of a shorter route if needed. All paths are sealed, flat and suitable for walkers, wheelchairs or motorised scooters. We end the walk at the Heritage Centre where morning or afternoon tea is served. The Centre has all abilities access and toilet available, with plenty of car parking adjacent. After refreshments you are free to browse through the Gallery area where we have our displays of local history.

Entry is \$5 - Seniors are free this month. We have a great supply of books for sale to further explain our special history, souvenirs and information handouts if desired. Come along and join in!

Keeping you informed about your local Murchison Retirement Village.

In our last update, we provided a short story on John Pearce one of our volunteer team member's at Wybalena, in this edition, we have a short story on another of our team members, this time it is Gerry Kleyn-Hesselink.

Much of the work to maintain the village is undertaken by a very active volunteer team as part of our commitment to keep the village costs as low as possible for our residents. Where required, we engage local trades to support this effort to maintain the village and its garden in good condition for our residents.

Our second volunteer story is that of Gerry Kleyn-Hesselink, who has been a volunteer member of the Wybalena Committee of Management and maintenance team since 2013.

Gerry was born in Holland, and came to Australia in his very early teens. Gerry left school at 14 years old to take on an apprenticeship as a painter/decorator. In 1973, Gerry made the big step of moving from Mitcham in Melbourne to the Murchison area.

Gerry has always had a love of horses and it can be said that he has horses in his blood. He saw that there was a role open at a horse stud close to Murchison so he immediately applied and got the role, he packed up his bags and made the move out of the big smoke. Gerry describes himself as a "horse nut", including stud grooming, breeding, riding, owning and looking after horses for the next six years at Pilgrims Warrick Stud.

Painting was a natural skill that Gerry had and his trade qualification topped that off and following his time at the local horse stud he decided to move back to his trade, painting and decorating.

The love of his life is his family including his wife Trudy and their two daughters, Kelly and Donna. Gerry and Trudy have four grandchildren and believe it or not all of the family are keen on anything to do with horses.

Gerry has a keen interest in restoring old cars and these have included a 1940 Chevrolet, 1980 Mercedes, 1982 Datsun Ute. One of his pet projects was the restoration of a 10 year old ambulance into a motor home with all the bells and whistles you could imagine. Their motor home recently took both Gerry and Trudy (and their 12yo dog Ruby) on a trip to Northern Australia as part of their 50year wedding anniversary. The whole family love the community spirit in Murchison and as such, both daughters have set up their homes in the Goulburn Valley area.

# difference of the second secon



The Nagambie Library will welcome author Megan Rogers to speak about her recently published book The Heart is a Star on Thursday 23rd November at 2.30pm.

Layla Byrnes is exhausted. She's juggling a demanding job as an anaesthetist, a disintegrating marriage, her young kids, and a needy lover. And most particularly she's managing her histrionically unstable mother, who repeatedly threatens to kill herself.

When her mother rings just before Christmas, she doesn't follow the usual script. Instead, she tells Layla that there's something she needs to tell her about her much-loved father. In response, Layla drops everything to rush to her childhood home on the wild west coast of Tasmania. She's determined to finally confront her mother - and find out what really happened to her father - and lay some demons to rest.

The Heart is a Star is an engrossing and powerfully absorbing novel about the complicated and beautiful messiness of life and about how we can uncover our true selves. Megan Rogers began her working life as an editorial assistant at Allen & Unwin, before moving to the State Library of Victoria as a Marketing Manager. In 2014 Megan finished a PhD in Creative Writing at RMIT, which resulted in the book, Finding the Plot: a maternal approach to madness in literature published by feminist publisher Demeter Press. She also has a Bachelor of Arts/Science (Monash), a Diploma of Professional Writing and Editing (RMIT), a Graduate Diploma in Professional Communication (Deakin), and a Masters of Marketing (Monash). The Heart is a Star is her first novel.

#### MDBP HEARINGS

Water buybacks rip the economic heart out of our region – I get it. But it's hard to get some people in Canberra to understand. The Senate will hold an inquiry about changes to the Murray Darling Basin Plan but there will only be two hearings, and both of those will be held in Canberra. This is incredibly disrespectful to Basin communities whose economic future is on the line.

Recently a Coalition Committee held hearings in Shepparton about changes to the plan. Myself and a number of Basin Coalition MPs listened to major processors, farmers and community leaders about how water buybacks and taking away an extra 450GL of water would devastate regions like ours. This was the first leg of a tour, listening to Basin communities.

We will take the damning findings back to the Senate Committee to ensure the voices of the Basin are heard. I encourage people to also make a written submission; it doesn't matter how short, to help me in the fight to protect our precious food bowl. Written submissions can be sent to my email or PO Box 884 Shepparton, VIC, 3632.

#### SALUTING THEIR SERVICE

# TELL ME ABOUT MURCHISON'S WORST ROADS

#### ANNABELLE CLEELAND MP, VICTORIAN MEMBER FOR EUROA

Nationals Member for Euroa Annabelle Cleeland wants to hear from you about the worst roads in the electorate.

The quality of our roads has deteriorated dramatically in the past few years, with regional Victoria bearing the brunt of repeated roads budget cuts and neglect.

"Sadly, road maintenance and the road resurfacing budget have all but been abandoned under this Labor Government," Ms Cleeland said.

"There are potholes, crumbling roadsides and compromised surfaces in almost every town in the region.

"These roads are causing problems for commuters, the transport industry, and visitors to our towns. Something needs to be done to address this issue."

Ms Cleeland said the safety of our roads remained a priority, with poor maintenance and conditions contributing to a higher than normal road toll so far this year.

"The road toll continues to rise, with far more deaths on our roads than previous years," Ms Cleeland said.

"We should be doing what we can to help prevent this issue, and it starts with the quality and safety of our roads.

"These roads needed fixing before the October floods and now the issue has only gotten worse."
